## Dogs can harm wildlife



Keep them under close control to  
minimise disturbance to wildlife  
and livestock.

## Wildlife Watching



Plants to look out for include  
blaeberry and bog asphodel. During the  
summer dragonflies and damselflies may  
be seen patrolling near the ponds.



Birds to look out for in the woods  
include goldcrests and nuthatch.  
Buzzards, hen harriers and  
kestrels can be spotted hunting  
over the moorland.

Keep an eye out for small animals such as  
wood mice, stoats and voles. If you are  
quiet and lucky you may spot a  
roe deer.



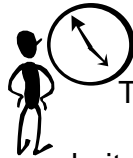
## Clyde Muirshiel Regional Park

**Windy Hill**

Views over to Ben Lomond. The route takes you across the heather clad moor.

2km, 1 mile  
Allow 1½ hrs  
moderate

Windy Hill has a steep grassy slope to the top.

**Country Trail**

Views of Misty Law to the south. Rhododendrons and Sitka spruce have been removed and aspen, willow and birch planted to encourage wildlife.

2km, 1 mile  
Allow 1 hr  
moderate

Gravel path with moderate slopes with some fairly steep sections.

**Waterfall Trail**

Views of the River Calder and the moorland. Look out for birds such as dipper and grey wagtail.

1km, ½ mile  
Allow ½ hr  
moderate

A narrow path from the kissing gate. There are some steep steps leading to the BBQ area.

**Habitat Trail**

A newly planted native woodland. In the pond you may see frogs and toads from early spring.

1km, ½ mile  
Allow ½ hr  
moderate

Gravel path with moderate slopes with two fairly steep sections.

**Mine Track Trail**

With good views over the moorland look out for skylarks in the summer and at any time of the year ravens and buzzards.

7km, 4 miles  
Allow 3 hrs  
moderate

The track has a stony surface to the disused Barytes Mine. The route is signposted at the bridge for the mine.
